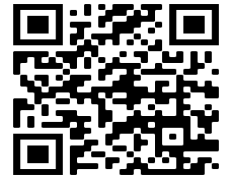

Shoe Drive at Wyoming United Presbyterian Church

Thank you to everyone who has donated shoes to our shoe drive. As of June 20th, we collected 2,025 pairs of shoes. If you haven't donated, it's not too late. We have extended our collection until July 15th.

What do we need? ANY shoe—dress shoes, sneakers, heels, or boots—men's, women's, or children's shoes.

Please ensure they are without holes, tears, or mismatched, and we must have both shoes—no singles allowed!

What happens to the shoes? After picking your shoes, they're sent to developing countries to create job opportunities. It's estimated 300 million people don't own shoes. Shoe drive fundraisers help provide inventory to over 4,000 micro-entrepreneurs who sell the shoes to support their families. In turn, they help themselves out of poverty with a hand up, not a handout.

From Rhonda Kruse, our new Presbytery Leader:

Volunteerism, the way people support churches (and presbyteries!) with their time and talents, has taken a huge hit since March 2020, and at this stage of the pandemic people are carefully assessing how they choose to spend their days. The age-old strategy of guilt-tripping people into volunteering simply doesn't work anymore. If guilt is your only motivator for encouraging service to the church, perhaps you need a new strategy!

Author and church consultant Susan Beaumont, in **Re-engaging the Volunteers**, a very helpful article on this topic, suggests churches acknowledge that “volunteerism hasn’t worked well for some time. We have been recruiting people to serve in board and committee structures not well suited for ministry today. We have not done a good job defining role expectations for our volunteer positions and we have subjected people to too many meetings that have little to do with ministry.”

Where do we go from here? I strongly encourage you to read her article, (https://www.congregationalconsulting.org/re-engaging-the-volunteers/?mc_cid=106a55ef7f&mc_eid=d3ee8b7aad) in which she elaborates on seven strategies congregations can use to revitalize volunteerism.

- Evaluate needs and streamline roles.
- Embrace technology.
- Promote flexibility.
- Move toward episodic micro-volunteering.
- Clarify the expected outcomes of volunteer assignments.
- Help people pursue passion.

The church is a volunteer organization. Without volunteers to do the work of ministry, the church (and presbytery!) is simply not sustainable. If your congregation has had success at re-imagining volunteerism, we’d love to hear about it!
