Dear Members & Friends of Trinity Presbyterian Church,

I am writing this Christmas letter to you after listening once again to what I consider to be one of the most beautiful musical compositions produced through what I believe to be the inspiration of the Holy Spirit Himself. Together, as you and I enter the Season of Advent, I always like to take time to renew my acquaintance with The Messiah written by George Handel in the year 1741. To me, this magnificent piece of music captures the glory and wonder of the birth and life of the Lord Jesus better than any other musical creation I know. What follows is an outline of the history and structure of Handel's *Messiah* that I share with you in the hope that all of us will take time during the upcoming holidays to enjoy and enrich our lives through the spiritual reservoir The Messiah offers to those of us who affirm the reality of the Christ Child who gives us life more abundant . . . for unto you is born . . . a Savior. (Luke 2:11)

Christmas & Handel's Messiah



In the two hundred years that have come and gone since *The Messiah* first brought tears to the eyes of its creator and filled him with the vision of heaven and the "Great God Himself," it has perhaps moved and thrilled more music lovers than any other choral work in the repertoire of church choirs the world over. Many, I'm sure, at Trinity Presbyterian Church enjoy listening to this

wonderful piece of musical work each year. To be sure, this work in its entirety, beginning with the message of "Peace on earth to men of goodwill" and the inherent promise of a better world to come, embodied in the text and clothed with the vibrant power and beauty of Handel's art, are as potent today as they were two hundred years ago.

To me it seems that in this statement lies the clue to the attraction it holds today for the ordinary listener like us. It is not so much the music as it is the message! Many of Handel's other works are virtually unknown today simply because they do not carry the same message.

Interestingly, I have learned that Handel was fifty-six years of age when, in 1741, he composed *The Messiah.* The work is massive, requiring about two and one-half hours for a complete performance, and yet its composition took only twenty-four days. Amazing! The text consists of passages from the Bible that were selected and arranged by a clergyman named Pooley. Alas, credit for it was claimed by a friend of Handel by the name of George Jennens, who employed Pooley as a secretary. In the work is found music of both the simplest and complex nature, and very heavy demands are made not only on the solo voices, but on the chorus as well. The average listener, like us, does not become fatigued, however, because the contrast of the aria, recitative, and chorus is carefully worked out to balance the entire work. Church organists are quick to make this aspect of Handel's work known.

What is referred to as the libretto of *The Messiah* is made up of verses and passages quoted from the King James Version of the Holy Scriptures. Again, it of interest to note that there are three divisions in which are presented the central message of the Bible: 1) the prophecy as to the coming of the Savior and the story of His nativity; 2) the life suffering and death of the Savior; 3) the assurance that is the heritage of every believer concerning His resurrection.

The prophecy of Isaiah in chapter 40, where God enable him to see beyond the captivity of Israel to the coming of the Messiah opens the work:

Comfort ye, comfort ye my people, saith your God; speak ye comfortably to Jerusalem; and cry unto her, that her Iniquity is pardoned.

The voice of Him that crieth in the wilderness. 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

Every valley shall be exalted, and every mountain and hill made low; the crooked straight, and the rough places plain.

And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together; for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it.'

Meanwhile, utterances from Haggai and Malachi lead to the rich detail of Isaiah 7:14 "Behold a virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Emmanuel, God with us." Even the inclusion of the Gentiles in God's plan of salvation is brought out in the bass solo from Isaiah 60:2,3.

Then there is the naming of the Son: "Wonderful, Counselor, the Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace," that is followed by a pastoral symphony that I believe is a fitting prelude to the story of the nativity from Luke 2 which it introduces. Listeners like you and I will then note that the first part closes with the invitation of Jesus Christ to: "Come unto Him".

Next, we come to what is called Part I . . . "for His yoke is easy and His burden is light". In which the keynote is the injunction in the opening solo to "Behold, the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world." Nine of the twenty-three selections that follow are devoted to the suffering and death of the Lord, over half of these are quotations from Isaiah 53. Moreover, as is characteristic in the Bible record, the death of the Savior is the prelude to His resurrection and ascension. These aspects are prominent in Handel's work.

Findally, the assurance of the believer that is expressed in Part III is a fitting conclusion, I think, to this sacred oratorio. It exults with Job: "I know that my Redeemer liveth, and that He shall stand at the latter day upon the earth", and with the Apostle Paul reiterates Christ's victory over sin and death as set forth in I Corinthians 15. And, from the New Testament's Romans 8 where one rejoices: "If God be for us, who can be against us?", and finally it expresses adoration as the angels and the universe shall do one day when all pay allegiance to the Lord: "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain, and hath redeemed us to God by His blood, to receive power and riches and wisdom and strength and honor, glory and blessing. Blessing and honor, glory and power be unto Him that sitteth upon the throne and unto the Lamb, forever and ever. Amen."

It also might interest you to know that this masterpiece is usually presented in two portions. The first part, including the nativity, is most popular at this time of the year when we celebrate Christmas. The last two parts are typically enjoyed at Easter. Thankfully, today it is no longer necessary to request ladies to refrain from wearing hoops and men their swords as was done as the London premiere in 1742 to accommodate a larger audience, but the attraction of the work has not lessened at all! Many, like you and me, listen primarily to the music, but the words are plain and inescapable . . . As I'm sure you can well imagine, it is my prayer during this Advent and Christmas Season that our keen awareness of the message empowers us to introduce those of our friends and neighbors who might not be acquainted with Handle's *Messiah* to God's Messiah, the Lord Jesus Christ.

Indeed, may the same Lord Jesus fill your hearts with joyful music this Christmas! Wishing all of our Trinity Presbyterian Church family of faith a blessed holiday. Karin and I join with you in the joyful celebration of the Light of the world, the infant Jesus born in Bethlehem.

Peace on Earth and goodwill to all who call upon His blessed name.

The women will host the Second Sunday reception on December 11th. Our theme will be "Come Home for Christmas."


Our December meeting will be at Allyson Lord's house on Wednesday, December 7th at noon.
