Our meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. Jen Baer

Fellowship of the Least Coin offering - \$28 donated to date. An additional offering was taken at this meeting, adding another \$33 to our total = \$61. We usually try to raise and send \$100 by the end of the year.

Prayer Shawl Ministry report by Carol Hobbs. The knitters will donate scarves again this year at Christmas time to the members of the Dallas Senior Center. We thank them for their generosity to our area seniors.

Greeting card ministry report by Betsy Fairchild. We thank Betsy for her continued efforts to reach out to our church members and others with cards and notes. Several cards have been sent so far in 2021 with many positive comments from their recipients.

We hosted the reception on the lawn after the church service on Father's Day, June 20 – thank you to everyone who helped.

Thank you also to those who made donations and helped with the rummage sale.

Thank you to everyone who brought in food and monetary donations for the Back Mountain Food Pantry No Hungry Tummies Program. Cash donations totaled \$250, and we also received 4 large containers of nonperishable food (about 200 pounds) for this children's summer nutrition program.

We will place the flowers in the sanctuary on Sunday, August 29th.

Suggestions were solicited for future meeting dates and places to meet. Wednesdays and Thursdays seemed to be the best days of the week for the group members, and they mentioned Irem, Agolinos and the Skillet as good choices of a place to meet. Several restaurants in the Back Mountain are not open for lunch at this time. Suggestions for a fundraiser – in our last meeting, we all decided that the Bakeless Bake Sale would once again be our annual fundraiser to enable us to make a nice donation to the church operating account. This event will take place in the fall.

Suggestions for donations which were approved by the group: (1) NE Sight Services - \$100 (2) Meals on Wheels - \$100 (3) Camp Lackawanna – for 10 staff members – provide food for their Sunday lunch on August 1^{st -} \$50-\$75.

A request was made for donations to the Women of Trinity annual budget – special offering envelopes were made available for this purpose.

Suggestions for a Christmas project: we will provide gift bags for the members of the Dallas Senior Center – to be given out at the Dallas Rotary annual Christmas party for the seniors at the Appletree Terrace in Dallas.

Thoughts and prayers for our members and their families: in closing our meeting, special prayer requests were put forth by several members to pray for those who are ill or for those who are going through life changing experiences. They need our love and support.
