Dear Members & Friends of Trinity Presbyterian Church,



As we begin to contemplate the Lenten Season that began Ash Wednesday, February 22nd, perhaps nothing offers us better direction on our Lenten journey than the words Jesus spoke to his disciples in Matthew 6 in which he said, Give alms . . . Pray to your Father . . . Fast without a gloomy face. (Mt. 6:1-18)

## **Almsgiving**

When we read of the giving of alms in the pages of Holy Scripture as Jesus teaches, we discover that it means the making of the needs of others our own, especially the needy of our world. For Jesus knows that they are all around us: children and the aged, the sick and suffering, families and individuals, next-door neighbors and people in lands far away . . . And Jesus knows how easy it is for us to forget them. Rather than looking out for ourselves as part of the community of faith, our giving involves some time, some of our talent, material resources, and whatever else that we can provide for the good of Christ's Church . . . Whatever we give, though, should be something of ourselves, something that costs us. For Jesus understands that the paradox of giving is that when we give, we receive some blessing from God in return . . . So, what shall we give to the needy in the Lenten Season? In deciding, we need, I believe, to decide generously. After all, before us is the great gift of alms Jesus himself gave: He loved us, and gave himself up for us.

#### **Prayer**

The Lenten Season also calls us to pray. But prayer, Jesus teaches us, is much more than saying words. Go into your room and close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. Thus, it seems that before we pray, let us enter the inner room of our hearts. Let us shut the door to the noise, the trivialities, the countless cares of the day grabbing for our attention. Let us put them aside. In the quiet place of our heart, with faith as our guide, let us speak to God. Rest assured, a gracious Father listens, and he knows what we need. God helps us pray in this season . . . For those who have stopped praying, or pray with little fervor, God gives graces for praying again. And the amazing thing is that the graces come as we turn to prayers and practices already there: reflective reading of the Bible or some other spiritual books, the sacrament of communion, simple grace-filled prayers, like the Lord's prayer and the Psalms. What a Christian should be doing at all times should be done now with greater care and devotion, is what church leaders told Christians of the 6th Century who were beginning their Lenten observance.

# **Fasting**

Jesus tells us, *When you fast do not look gloomy*. To be sure, we all know that in today's consumer society people look upon fasting itself to be gloomy. Urging everyone to eat, drink, and buy more, our world today has made fasting unfashionable . . . Ye we know that the Gospel message says acquiring more and more can ruin human life. An acquisitive spirit is a selfish spirit. And as the alarming numbers of people addicted to drugs and alcohol today prove, the taste for too much can destroy . . . Food and drink, clothes and amusements - the good things of life - can turn into our captors, Jesus teaches. And so, in our acquisitive, pleasure-oriented society, fasting is a way of keeping ourselves free . . . During this Lenten Season, I suggest that recognizing the hold things have on us, perhaps we should try (with God's help) to keep them in their place. Some reasonable abstaining from food, drink, and entertainment can help us do that . . . If nothing else, today we have new and compelling reasons for taking fasting seriously. As the resources of our planet are increasingly threatened, it becomes clear that the human family (especially those living in affluent nations like ours) can no longer afford to be unlimited consumers. We must develop a leaner, less wasteful way of life, if our planet is to survive.

Can the Christian perspective on fasting lead us to a gentler style of living on planet earth? Apparently, Jesus thought so . . . Thus, I suggest that we all take time in this Season of Lent to *Give Alms, Pray, and Fast.*
