


On Palm Sunday our Children's Choir sang during the worship service and walked about the sanctuary waving palms to commemorate the special day.

- 3. Baptisms scheduled for May 1:

- 2. Zackary Coy has finished phase one of his Eagle Scout Project.
- 3. Scout Troop 218 has requested to start another Eagle Scout Project at Trinity. Elder Mark Chappell will coordinate the project for Trinity.
- Mark Chappell reported that he requested six estimates for the repairs to the parking lot. He only received one response with an estimate of \$7,640. This estimate was approved by the Session and work on the parking lot will begin on June 14, 2022.

"What is happening at Trinity?"



- 2. On June 12, Trinity will celebrate our 60th anniversary. On behalf of the Session, I wish to thank everyone who has prayed for, labored with and financially supported this church over the past 60 years. There will be more details about the Anniversary in the newsletter.
- 3. We also are about to embark on a new journey.
- 4. We are very fortunate to have a strong Board of Deacons and Session that are ready, willing and able to lead us on this journey into the future.
- 5. The Session has obtained a wonderful list of Commissioned Pastors to serve as Pulpit Supply covering May 8 through June 26.
