Empty stocks, drying maple leaves and the absence of apples in the beautiful Endless Mountains of northeastern Pennsylvania are signs of the times. In the words of the prophet, the summer is ended, the harvest is past and perhaps some would add and we are not saved (Jer. 8:20). Still, that is not the attitude these days. The empty stocks we see nestled on the small Pennsylvania farms of the Susquehanna River Valley are bound together in great barrel-shaped rolls, ready to be used by farm animals that so dot the hills of this part of God's earth. People spend brilliant sunny days looking at the remaining maple leaves celebrating their color. The absence of apples and red tomato plants in the farmer's fields is called harvest, a time for special thanksgiving. It is curious what happens to the obvious when the subtle meanings of the season's cycle put these days into perspective.

Moreover, noting the difficulty we have applying that subtlety to our lives is also curious. So often when we have emptied ourselves in some effort, we lament about tiredness, fatigue and overwork. When life moves toward the Fall of our years, we have difficulty capturing the beauty, color and meaning they can hold. Whenever death vacates a place in our circle that is viewed with defeat and despair. The cycle of the seasons seems applicable – even creative – when we think of empty corn stocks, drying maple leaves and the russet-colored mountain meadows. Nevertheless, as we become involved, the result is often all too melancholy. The Gospel thankfully addresses these human concerns. It teaches us the wonderful joy of having emptied oneself in loving commitment. It rejoices in the wisdom and beauty of years that have gained insight and experience. Of course it celebrates death not as a conclusion, but rather as a transition. That is why at the beginning of the month of November, All Saints' Day appears on the Christian liturgical calendar. That is what Revelation means when the gospel writer John voices *death shall be no more* (Rev. 21:4). So let us live meaningfully all the days of our lives my dear Trinity friends and neighbors in Christ.

The regular meeting of the Session was held on October 24, 2023, at Trinity Presbyterian Church, Dallas, PA. The following items were discussed and acted upon by the Session.

- 1. The Session approved the wedding of Michelle Scionti and Robert Bruno during the month of May 2024.
- 2. The Board of Deacons will host a Veterans Day reception on November 12, 2023.
- 3. The Board of Deacons will be decorating the church for Christmas on November 26, after church. This date may be changed as we get closer to Christmas.
- 4. The Endowment Committee reported that they transferred \$15,000 from the Endowment Fund to the Trinity Presbyterian Church 2023 General budget.
- 5. The Endowment Fund will sponsor the Stewardship dinner on November 19.
- 6. The Session approved the 2024 Operating Budget of \$156,960. The Endowment Fund will be asked to provide \$15,000.00 to the 2024 budget to help with the short fall.
- 7. THE FRANK LINDEN HOWORTH AND MARGARET JONES HOWORTH MEMORIAL TRUST has disbursed \$15,000.00 during this year. A number of churches activities were recipients.
- 8. The Mission/Outreach Committee reported the following:
 - a) RISE AGAINST HUNGER is scheduled for November 18, 2023.
 - b) JUMP START OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD: Inventory of items on hand was taken and a list of needed items was compiled to determine what we will need to prepare 30 boxes.

- c) HAWAIIAN WILDFIRE COLLECTION: The collection is still ongoing. The Deacons have collected \$643.
- d) On October 30, 2023 the Mission Outreach Committee will hold a Trunk or Treat at Trinity. Decorating of trunks will start at 8:45 AM and finish by 9:30 AM.
- e) NOVEMBER 5: Samaritan's Purse The Committee will pack all boxes to send. Five boxes will be packed but remain open to be blessed by Rev. Thompson on November 5, 2023.
- The Stewardship Committee will hold a Stewardship luncheon on November 19, 2023 following the morning worship service as part of our 2024 Stewardship Drive. Stewardship letters will be sent to all members prior to November 19, 2023.
- *10.* The Trinity Learning Center reported student enrollment at 38.
 - a) **TRUNK OR TREAT** will be held on October 30, 2023 starting at approximately 10 am in the back parking lot. This project is sponsored by the Outreach Committee.
 - b) **FLU SHOT CLINIC** was scheduled 9/20 or 9/27, based on the availability of Rite Aid. The Clinic is available to TLC members and staff and also all members of the congregation.
- 11. The next Presbytery meeting will be held on November 18, 2023 at Johnsonburg, NJ.The Rev. Dr. Thompson will represent Trinity at the meeting.
- 12. The Women of Trinity donated \$850.00 to the General Operating Fund of Trinity. They will also host the "Come Home for Christmas" reception on December 10, 2023.
- 13. <u>**HELPING HANDS COMMITTEE</u>** The committee has the following activity scheduled.</u>
 - a) Soup Sale The committee will host a Soup Sale and basket raffle on December 2, 2023 at Trinity. Soup will be sold for \$5.00 per pint and \$10.00 per quart.
- 14. The Session approved Rev. Thompson's request to conduct a study of the first five books of the Bible: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy (Pentateuch). The dates for the Bible Study will be announced later.
