On Sunday November 14th, the Deacons will be hosting 2nd Sunday in honor of our veterans.



The Deacons will be collecting non-perishable food items starting the week of 10/17, and ending 11/21. The food will be donated to the Back Mountain Food Pantry. We are also adopting 6 families from the Back Mountain, and will be presenting them with Weis gift cards if you would prefer to make a cash donation.



The following food items are needed:

peanut butter, jelly, canned vegetables, stuffing mix, cranberry sauce, canned fruit, gravy, instant potatoes, canned or bottled juice, rice or rice mixes, cereal, sugar, salt, flour, cake mixes, icing, canned tuna or chicken, coffee, tea, pie filling, canned soup, pudding & Jell-O mixes, spaghetti or tomato sauce, pasta, powdered drink mixes.



This summer our camp staff welcomed more than 75 students to our 9 weeks of camp offerings. I want to thank our summer staff that helped to keep our campers safe and having fun; Lisa Degraba, Jessie Dixon, Kendall Decker, Ella Fleschut, Joan Rovinsky, Chloe Dudick, Lexie Strobel, and Nancy Doherty. Special thanks to our summer camp staff leaders; Deb Baloga, Alexa Decker, and Madison Baloga. Valerie Hutzinger led our efforts in cleaning, organizing, and helping us

prepare for the 2021-22 school year, and all of our staff played a part in reorganizing our classrooms to better use our shared resources.

Despite the large turnout for summer camp, our fall enrollment at TLC is smaller than desired. Many parents are still unsure about sending children to nursery school while COVID-19 is still present in the community. TLC typically enrolls 75-85 children during the school year, and we have less than half of these students this year. We also lost the potential for afternoon Kindergarten Enrichment, as the Dallas School District has replaced their half-day offering with a full day. In responding to these set-backs, we have realigned program hours and staff to minimize the financial burden of this decreased enrollment. Even so, TLC has notified session that a rent decrease is necessary this year to sustain operations. Trinity Learning Center usually accounts for over \$36K of income for TPC. With the decreased income at the learning center, it is important that TPC has the ability to offer a rate reduction that corresponds to the lost income potential. Please keep this in mind with your planned giving, and consider giving more if you are able to help with this anticipated shortfall.

With a vaccine around the corner, and enrollment increasing, I would expect for this dip in enrollment to be temporary. We are working to minimize the financial impact of decreased enrollment, and plan to offer additional programming that may be more popular at the moment, such as a caregiver and me playgroup.

We had a successful orientation picnic on September 8th. It was a beautiful day, and Rev. Baer graciously assisted at our tie dye station. Silly Willy was on site with his ice cream truck. Pinewood Acres provided the ponies, and Barb Rinker and her daughter Lauren assisted with the pony rides. A great time was had by all, and the excitement of the day helped with a smooth transition back to school on September 13th.

We have a few new faces at TLC this year: Nancy Doherty, Jessica Bonomo, and Emma Simonette. Nancy will be our lead pre-nursery teacher and Jess and Emma are also assisting in the class. Jessica will also be assisting with the All-Day Pre-K class. We are excited to have them and wish them much success this year.

Please note that TLC is in session from 9-2:30 Monday-Thursdays. If you must come to the church during this time, please arrange it with Nicole and limit your visit to the church office. If you will be in any other part of the building, please let me know so that I can communicate it to the TLC staff. With new staff and procedures, it is imperative that all visitors are anticipated. We have drop off and pick-ups at 8:50-9, 10:50-11:30, 1 and 2:30- so these times are especially busy times in which visits should be avoided. Thanks for your cooperation. The regular meeting of the Session was held on September 27, 2021, at Trinity Presbyterian Church, Dallas, PA. The following items were discussed and acted upon by the Session.

- 1. Elder Chappell reported on the progress of the LED light conversion project.
- 2. The Session minutes for 2020 were reviewed by Dale Barber, Clerk, Valley United Church, Waverly, NY and determined to be accurate complete and very thorough.
- 3. The Session reviewed the COVID -19 requirements for the church and voted to continue with the policy established on May 24, 2021. The following are those recommendations.
 - a. As of May 24, 2021 all members and visitors, who have been vaccinated, are not required to wear a mask while at Trinity.
 - b. If you have not been vaccinated, you will still be required to wear a mask and observe social distancing.
 - c. Since children have not been vaccinated, they will still be required to wear masks.
 - d. Members will no longer be required to make reservations for seating.
 - e. All barriers closing off sections of the pews will be removed.

Wearing of a mask by vaccinated individuals is a personal decision, and if you prefer to wear a mask, please feel free to do so.

- 3. Rev. Baer reported that Presbytery retreat was cancelled as several who were going to attend tested positive for COVID.
- 4. Rev. Baer will be gone the first week in October at a conference about finding the way forward in a changing world.
- 5. Karen Perzia, Treasurer, prepared a tentative budget for 2022 in the amount of \$206,975. This budget may require funding assistance from the Endowment Fund.

- 6. Karen Perzia, Treasurer, submitted a review of insurance for Trinity. After review and debate, the Session approved the insurance policy from Brotherhood Mutual.
- 7. The Nominating Committee is still seeking names for positions of Elders and Deacons. The names can be placed in the offering plate or in Art Peoples' mailbox in the office.
- 8. The Trinity Learning Center reported that they had a successful Summer Camp. A special "Thank You" to Jennifer Sgarlat and her staff.
- 9. The Trinity Learning Center distributed the TLC'S 2021-2022 Student Handbook and calendar for TLC.
- 10. Elder Wayne Williams reported that the Men's Club had a successful Chicken and Biscuit Dinner with approximately 200 meals served.
- 11. The Session approved the Deacon's request to hold a food drive starting in the middle of October and ending before Thanksgiving.
- 12. Special Sunday being celebrated at Trinity:

 - b. October 31 Reformation Sunday
 - c. November 7 All Saints Day
 - d. November 14 Veterans Day
