Karin's Delicious Slaw

16 oz. package coleslaw mix

Crispy Mixture:

- 1 cup toasted sliced almonds
- 1 cup roasted, salted sunflower seeds
- 2 packages Ramen noodles (Oriental or Soy Sauce flavor) set flavor packet aside, crush noodles.

After toasted almonds and sunflower seeds are cooled, mix with crushed dry noodles in a gallon zip lock baggie and shake to mix. Store in the baggie to keep fresh and crisp.

Dressing:

1 cup salad oil

½ cup white vinegar

½ cup sugar

2 flavor packets from Ramen noodles

Mix dressing and chill for at least one (1) hour (works well to make in a mason Jar). Shake or stir before using. Combine coleslaw mix, Crispy Mixture and dressing just before serving.

If only fixing for 2 or 3, you do not need to use all of the coleslaw mix, Crispy Mixture and dressing – just combine the amount you need for one serving and serve the rest for another meal. It is best fresh so the Crispy Mixture doesn't get soft.


There was no meeting of the Session during the month of September 2022, but the following items were discussed and approved by electronic communications.
